Priorities of the year, objectives pursued and expected results	Cooperation on Integrated Maritime Policy in the Black Sea and Mediterranean Sea needs to be fostered through concrete projects and initiatives and by involving concerned countries and multilateral organisations.
	This action aims at supporting IMP approaches and initiatives and promoting job creation, innovation and entrepreneurship in the blue economy of the Black Sea and/or Mediterranean Sea.
	The action will involve the award of grants each covering one of the following objectives:
	a) To pilot public-private partnerships amongst Black Sea and/or Mediterranean stakeholders in order to promote mutual understanding, awareness-raising and joint responses to well-identified challenges hindering integration between maritime sectors in areas such as marine environment, coastal and maritime tourism, maritime transport, business and skills

development;

b) To promote the networking between maritime clusters in the Black Sea and/or the Mediterranean on concrete initiatives/topics focusing on research and innovation, business development or skills development, in relation to the maritime policy/the blue economy.

The projects should result in concrete initiatives/outputs for i) stimulating cooperation between maritime stakeholders, ii) stimulating innovation and entrepreneurship, iii) promoting further integration between IMP-related sectors.

Essential eligibility, selection and award criteria

Eligibility criteria:

Project applicants (lead Partner) can be public authorities or private entities (profit or non-profit) **established and active in the EU**.

Selection criteria:

Applicants must have a demonstrated experience in the area of maritime affairs/blue economy and adequate technical (human resources, equipment, etc.) capacity to implement the actions to be co-financed.

Applicants must have the financial capacity to implement and complete the proposed project, and a yearly budget of at least twice the total costs of the proposed actions.

Award criteria:

- Relevance: the proposal should demonstrate how it meets the objectives of the call. The scope of the project should detail the starting point of the project, including an analysis of the limitations to overcome.
- Added value and innovation:
 - the proposal should provide EU added value in terms of innovative approach, increased cooperation between maritime stakeholders and across IMP-related sectors;
 - the proposal should also show its added value in terms of innovative approach, regional outreach and transferability of the actions, including the involvement of partners belonging to non-EU countries and improved capacity to exchange best practices.
- Sustainability and dissemination: the proposal should demonstrate the measures planned to ensure sustainability of initiatives developed and to disseminate the results and lessons learned to IMP stakeholders.
- Methodology and organisation: the proposal should demonstrate a sound, detailed, coherent, and effective methodological and organisational approach for the

	implementation of the proposed action.
	- The budget should be consistent with the technical proposal and the proposed action should be cost-efficient.

Priorities of the year, objectives pursued and expected results	The objective is to support the Member States in fulfilling their control and enforcement responsibilities under the CFP, from a regionalised perspective, by providing a Union financial contribution towards the joint chartering/purchase of control means (patrol vessels, aircrafts and helicopters ¹) which will be used by several Member States belonging to the same geographical area/sea basin in accordance with Article 87 (2) (a) of the EMFF. As regionalisation is a key element of the reformed CFP, this action represents an additional possibility for Member States in the area of control. It should increase the overall level of control activities, particularly those involving several Member States.
	The envelope is intended to cover the joint chartering of patrol vessels, aircrafts or helicopters in different geographical areas. It may also be used for the joint purchase of a patrol vessel, aircrafts or helicopters.
	All Member States with responsibility for fisheries control will be invited to submit a proposal specifying, inter alia, the geographical area concerned and the other Member States participating in the proposal. In accordance with Article 87 (4) of the EMFF Regulation, only one of the Member States per geographical area involved should be designated as the beneficiary, and will be granted the Union contribution. The chartered/purchased means have to be used in priority for Specific Control and Inspection Programmes (Article 95 of the Control Regulation ²), in common control programmes (Art. 94 of the Control Regulation), or in common control and inspection programmes (Art. 15 of the EFCA Regulation ³), unless otherwise agreed with the Commission.
	Proposals will be selected for financing on the basis of the following criteria:
	 Degree to which the patrol vessel, aircraft or helicopter will be used in control activities in support of relevant multi-annual plans where these exist (according to Article 46 of Control Regulation), and/or in support of the fulfilment of the EU's international obligations (ICCAT⁴; NAFO⁵/NEAFC⁶)
	 Number of Member States participating in the

chartering/**purchase** of the shared means in each geographical area compared to the potential number of participant Member States.

- The proposed cooperation and management mechanisms to be put in place by the participating Member States, to ensure optimal use of the vessel, aircraft or helicopter.
- Number of days for which the Member States have committed to use the vessel, aircraft or helicopter for fisheries control (minimum 60% of time spent at sea or in air).
- Compliance with a set of minimum technical requirements to be met.
- Quality of the methodology and effectiveness of the practical arrangements proposed for the management of the vessels, aircrafts or helicopters.
- Degree of adequacy of the means proposed for operational challenges faced (e.g. because of the specificity of the ocean and of the meteorology, patrol vessels will be preferred in the North and the Atlantic Sea, whereas aircrafts or helicopters will be preferred in the Mediterranean Sea).
- Value for money measured by the annual cost of the operation vs. the control activity to be undertaken.

The beneficiary Member States will be selected by DG MARE.

Except in the case of chartering of control means owned by a public authority (ministry, agency or other public entity), the beneficiary Member State shall respect all applicable rules on public procurement⁷.

In case of chartering:

Chartered control means may be publicly or privately owned.

A public authority (ministry, agency or other public entity) which owns control means cannot conclude a charter party with itself for using those means. The beneficiary public authority may, however, charter control means owned by another public authority of the same Member State or another Member State (in such cases, only the marginal costs incurred for the joint control activities may be considered for co-financing under this action).

The beneficiary Member State will conclude yearly contracts. These contracts should be renewable up to three times.
