### **Infosys submissions in 2019**

- EMFF Regulation (EU) No 508/2014, Article 97(1)(a) asks


  Managing Authorities (MAs) to provide the

  Commission, with relevant cumulative data on
  operations selected for funding up to the end of the
  previous calendar year; to be submitted by 31 March each
  year;
- **COVID 19** impacted both the submission process and the subsequent exchange of Infosys error reports the process was only considered to be accomplished in July 2020;
- The quality of reports continue to **improve**, due in part to the **updated FAME Infosys validation tool**.



### **EMFF** implementation – commitments (1)

 The EMFF committed amounted to EUR 3.21 billion or 55.8 % of the total EMFF funding available








EMFF commitments as percentage of total EMFF allocation








## Financial implementation (EUR million)






### Financial implementation per EMFF Article






### **Number of operations**


• The total number of operations reached 47 038 (36% increase from 31/12/2018)








### **State of progress of operations**






### Number of operations per MS and UP
