(1) Legal requirements I

- All legal requirements regarding communication on the EMFF are laid down in the EMFF Regulation.
- The relevant provisions are <u>Article 18, Article 119</u> and Annex V.
- Articles 115 to 117 of the CPR do not apply, as Part IV of the CPR refers to ERDF, ESF and CF only.





(1) Legal requirements II

Article 18: Content of the operational programme

"[...] the operational programme shall include: [...]

(m) implementing arrangements of the operational programme including [...]

(iv) the provisions to ensure that the programme is publicised in accordance with Article 119 of this Regulation."





(1) Legal requirements III

Article 119: Information and publicity

- 1. The managing authority shall be responsible [...] for:
 - (a) ensuring the establishment of a <u>single website</u> providing information on, and access to, the OP in the MS;
 - (b) <u>informing potential beneficiaries about funding</u> <u>opportunities</u> under the OP;
 - (c) publicising to citizens the role and achievements of the EMFF through <u>communication actions on the results and impacts of partnership agreements</u>, OPs and operations;
 - (d) ensuring that a <u>summary of measures to ensure</u> <u>compliance</u> with the CFP rules, including cases of non-compliance by MS or beneficiaries, as well as of remedy actions such as financial corrections, is made publicly available.



(1) Legal requirements IV

Article 119: Information and publicity (ctd)

- 2. MS shall maintain a list of operations
 - accessible through the single website
 - in CSV or XML format
 - updated at least every six months
 - Containing the minimum information laid down in Annex V
- Detailed rules are laid down in Annex V
- 4. Technical characteristics to be laid down in Implementing Acts, such as Implementing Regulation 763/2014





(1) Legal requirements V

Annex V: Information and publicity (ctd)

- 1. List of operations: min. of 12 information items, including a summary of the operation
- 2. Information and publicity measures for the public
 - major information activity publicising the OP launch;
 - at least twice during the programming period major information activity on funding opportunities and strategies pursued and on the achievements of the OP;
 - display of the flag or emblem at the MA premises;
 - electronic publication of the list of operations;
 - examples of operations, in a widely spoken official language of the Union other than the official MS language
 - summary of innovation and eco-innovation operations;



(1) Legal requirements VI

Annex V: Information and publicity (ctd)

- updated information about OP implementation
- summary of measures to ensure compliance with CFP rules, including cases of non-compliance by MS/ beneficiaries, and of remedy actions. e.g. financial corrections
- widest possible media coverage using various forms and methods of communication
- the following bodies shall be involved:
 - the partners referred to in Article 5 of CPR
 - information centres on Europe and COM representations in MS
 - educational and research institutions.

Annex V: Information and publicity (ctd)

3. Information measures for (potential) beneficiaries

For potential beneficiaries

- conditions of eligibility of expenditure;
- admissibility conditions for applications, procedures for examining applications for funding, time periods;
- selection criteria for operations;
- contacts at national, regional or local levels;
- Information that applications should propose communication activities to inform the public about the aims/targets and the Union support to the operation.

For beneficiaries

- Information that acceptance of funding constitutes the inclusion in the list of operations published in accordance with Article 119(2)

(2) State of play from the EMFF OPs I

- Most OPs provide limited information only on what is foreseen with regards communication
- Accordingly, it is not possible to assess whether all requirements have ben taken into account
- The majority of OPs included committments on the following requirements:
 - to set up a website (24),
 - inform beneficiaries (24),
 - publish achievements (20)
 - provide a list of operations in xml format (16)





(2) State of play from the EMFF OPs II

- However, most requirements were taken up by a smaller number of MS only:
 - information activity for the OP launch (13)
 - web publication of examples of operations in another than MS language (11)
 - display of EU-flag (11)
 - information on OP implementation (10)
 - summary of projects on innovation (9)
 - bi-annual updates of list of operations (8)
 - publication of compliance measures (6)
- Note: a few MS(5) referred to setting up a communication strategy as foreseen in Article 115 of the CPR, even though this is not a requirement for the EMFF.





(3) Conclusion and next steps

- Information provided in the OPs is insufficient.
- There is generally room for improvement in terms of ensuring that communication requirements are met.
- Closer monitoring will be needed.
- Monitoring Committees should be reminded of the legal requirements with regards communication.
- MAs should include communication as standard point on their agendas.
