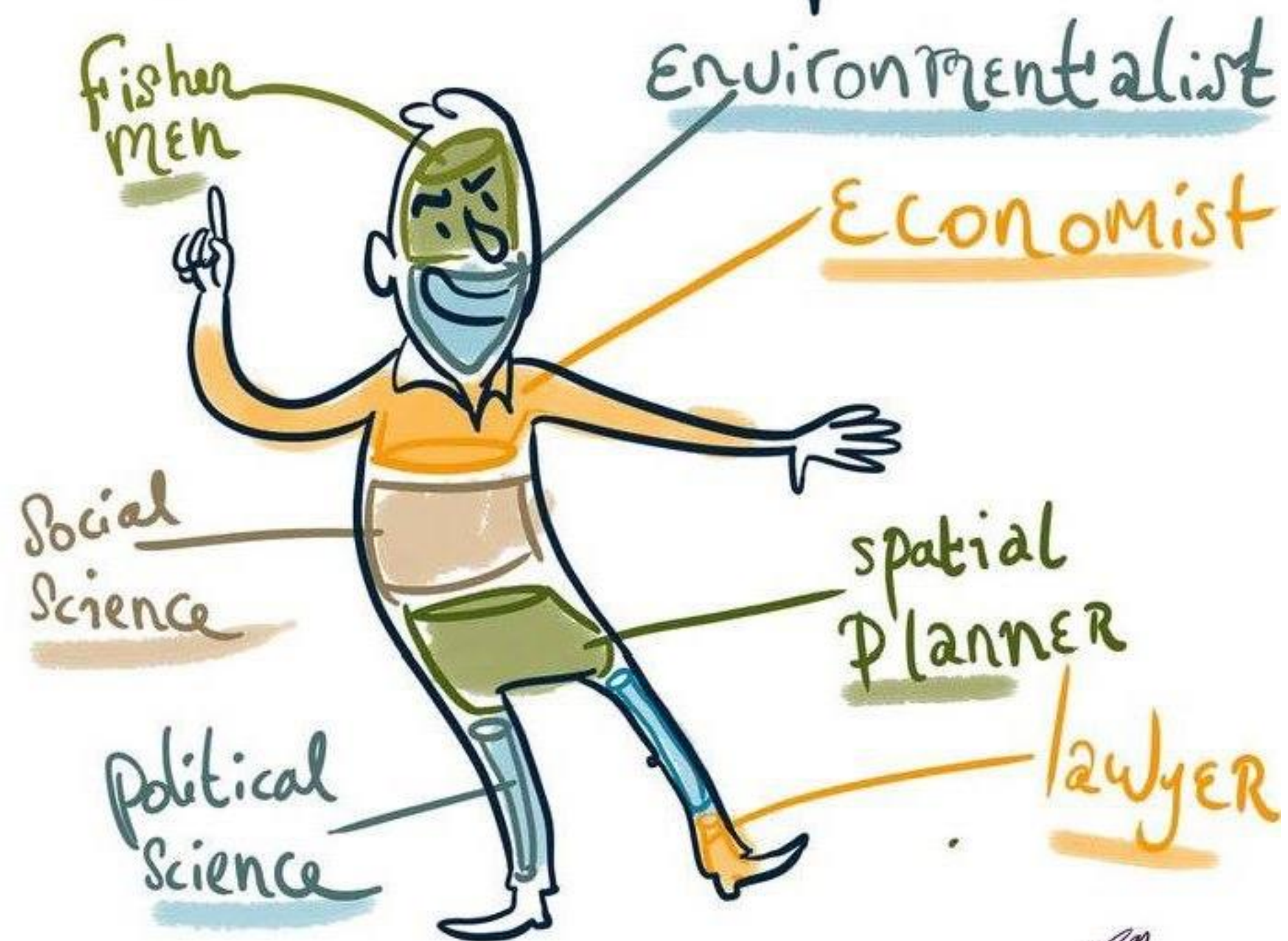

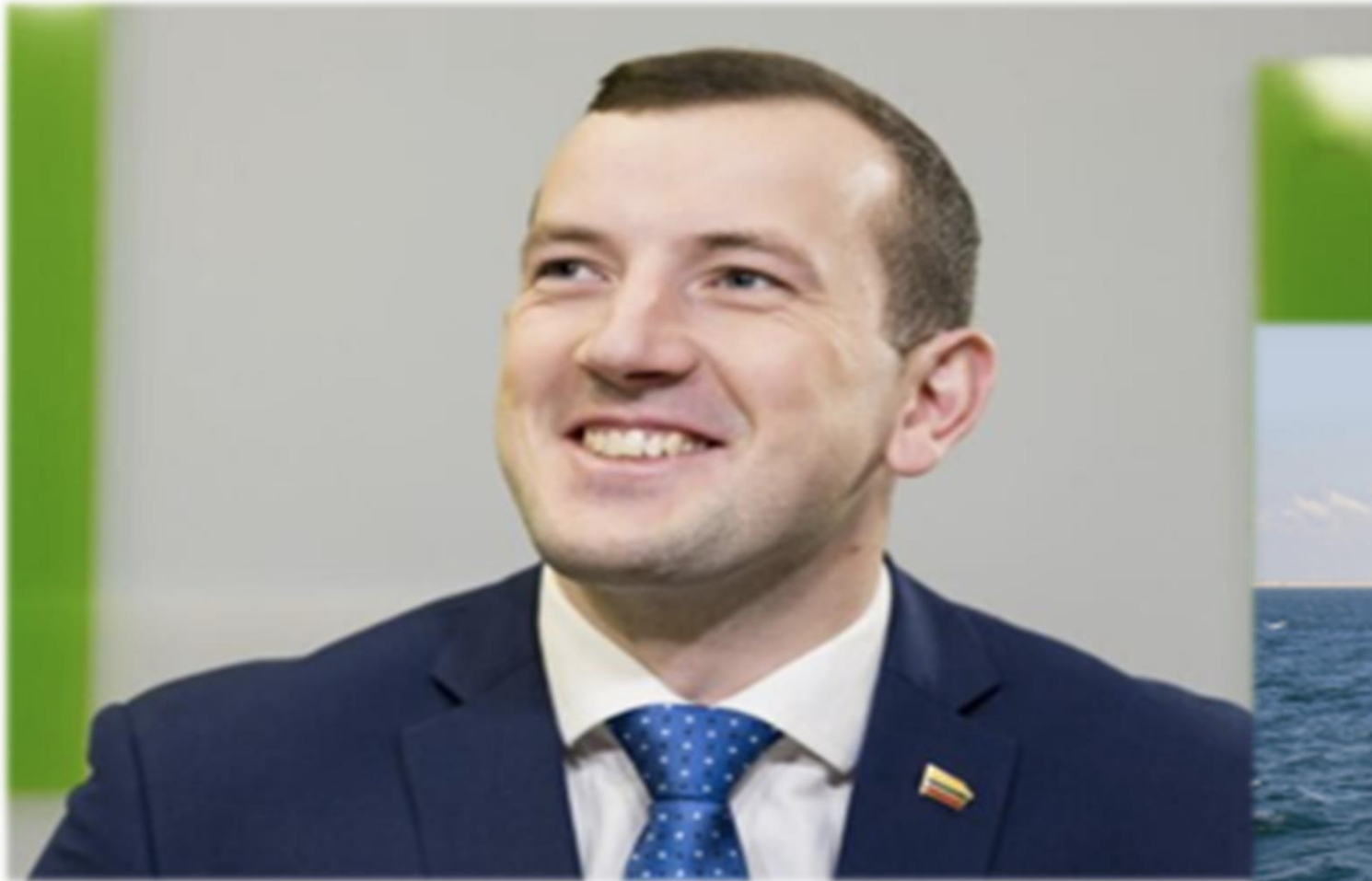

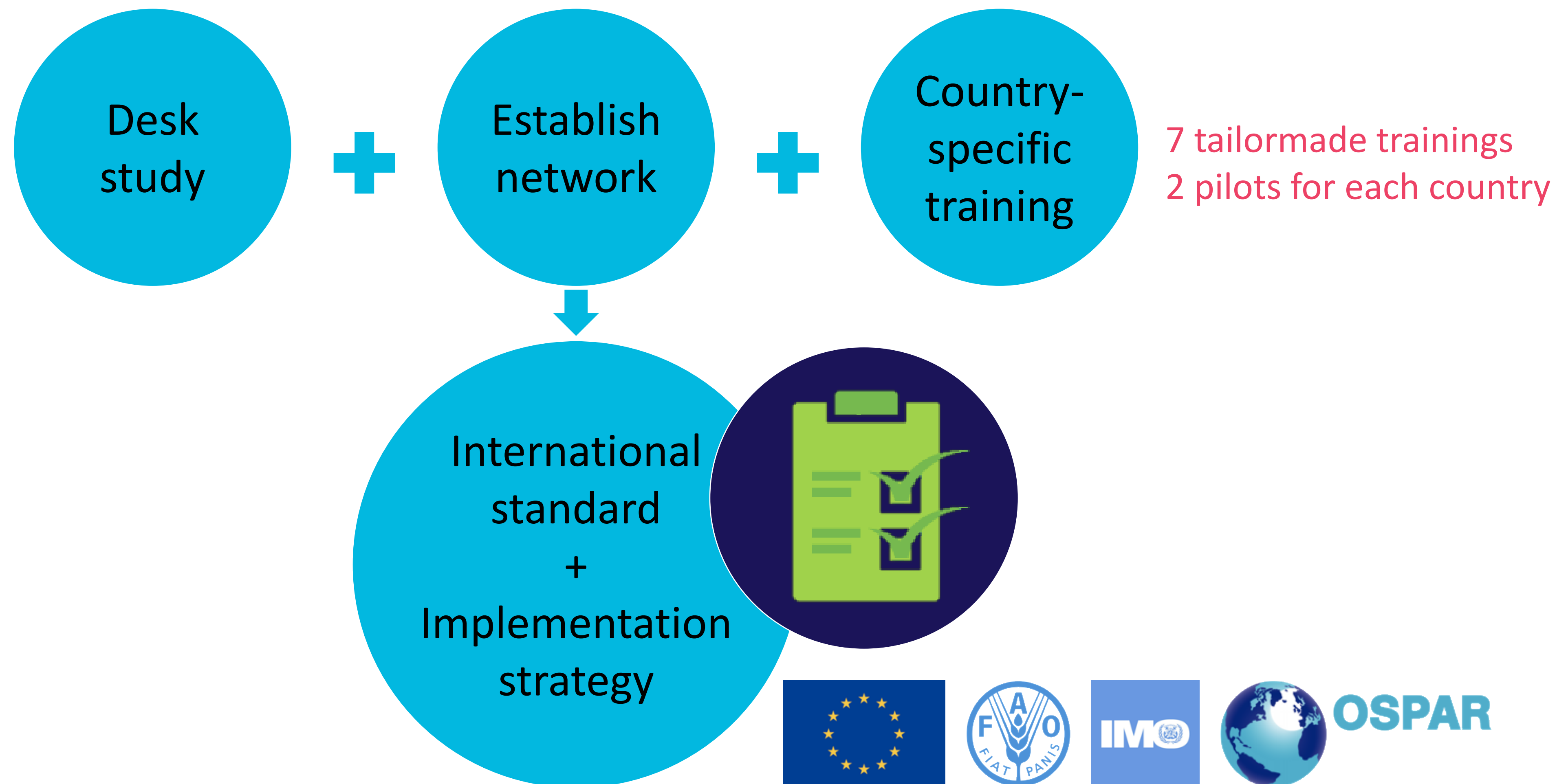

Challenges to tackle

1. Training pathways/requirements differ per EU Member State.
2. STCW-F not ratified by each EU Member State
3. There is considerable movement of fishers.
4. The diverse and complex requirements, and the absence of a common standard, pose a risk **for fishers, other users**, and the **marine environment** and could potentially contribute to **illegal work** and **worker exploitation**.
