## Internationalisation of EIA – possible options

#### Before we start:

- > Based on the ambition to establish an effective EIA system and lessons from existing EIA systems
- The presentation focuses on all activities conducted in the high seas, but may also apply to other activities with effects on high seas
- > Threshold:
- o not more than a minor or transitory impact: EIA process and decision-making with less internationalisation
- Possibly more than a minor or transitory impact: stronger internationalisation of EIA process and decisionmaking at the international level

Preferred option: presumption that all activities may have more than a minor or transitory impact (in view of limited knowledge, precaution), unless excluded through the identification of categories of activities by the COP

# Determination of the activities that should be subjected to EIA

#### **Options**

- Not more than a minor or transitory impact: EIA at national level with international guidance, info-exchange... (see preferred option: only categories identified by the COP)
- ➤ More than a minor or transitory impact:
- Presumption (all activities, unless ..); other options:
- Threshold with an indicative lists of activities
- Threshold with exhaustive list of activities
- Threshold with advice of the Scientific and Technical body
- Combinations of two or more of the above approaches

Internationalisation in relation to scoping	Approving terms of reference by the Scientific and Technical Body or an Subsidiary Body on Implementation, taking into account the results of consultation of other Parties and the public
International review in relation to the EIA process and report (correct process, quality, completeness, etc.)	International review by the Scientific and Technical body and/or a Subsidiary Body on Implementation
Internationalisation consultation of other Parties and Public Participation	<ul> <li>Public participation on the basis of scoping report and draft EIA report, conducted by the Scientific and Technical body or Secretariat</li> <li>International consultation of other Parties and the public by national competent authorities for projects excluded from international decision-making</li> </ul>
Internationalisation of decision-making on the allowance of activities	<ul> <li>Possibly more than a minor or transitory impact: Decision-making by the COP, taking into account the advice of the Scientific and technical body and the results of EIA process</li> <li>Not more than a minor or transitory impact: Decision-making at national level (preferred option: only for categories of activities identified by the COP)</li> </ul>

Internationalisation regarding compliance	<ul> <li>Reporting mechanism</li> <li>International inspections by other Contracting Parties</li> <li>International compliance committee separate from Scientific and Technical Body (similar to Aarhus Compliance Committee; members nominated by COP, serving in individual capacity)</li> </ul>
Internationalisation dissemination of information	<ul> <li>Public access to all EIA related documentation (incl. e.g., scoping opinions, draft and Final EIA Reports and Decisions)</li> <li>Collection of all EIA related documentation (incl. e.g., scoping opinions, draft and Final EIA Reports and Decisions) in an EIA Database</li> </ul>
Internationalisation regarding monitoring	<ul> <li>Reporting on monitoring results (project level) and making those reports publicly available</li> <li>Review of monitoring results by Scientific and Technical body</li> <li>Tools for addressing unexpected adverse effects (e.g., possibility to cancel/stop the activity as an interim measure until COP)</li> </ul>
