
EMFF direct management

- Overall amount for 2014-2020 established in EMFF regulation: EUR 647,3 million
- Breakdown across spending areas governed by percentages in annex III to regulation (Art 14)
- Any departure from indicative percentages are limited to 5% of financial envelope in each case
- Expenditure entered in work programmes for 2014 and 2015 respect Art. 14
- Large part of implementation of actions delegated to EASME






WP 2014 & 2015 - allocation


Main areas:

- 2014: slow start, but all actions ongoing or finalised; 2015: procedures launched for most actions

- Marine knowledge Background
 - Improved data allows to:
 - ✓ Increase productivity
 - √ Stimulate innovation
 - ✓ Reduce uncertainty
 - 160 organisations working together on European Marine Observation and Data Network (EMODnet) to:
 - ✓ Increase observations
 - ✓ Enhance interoperability
 - ✓ Unlock access www.emodnet.eu





- Marine knowledge Seabasin checkpoints
 - Shift to "collect data once, use for many purposes" paradigm
 - 4 contracts awarded (Arctic, Atlantic, Baltic, Black Sea) for total of € 4,2m
 - Consortia of public and private bodies
 - Challenges faced:
 - ✓ Is there enough data to site a wind farm
 - ✓ Are Marine Protected Areas a coherent set
 - √ How are our seas warming
 - ✓ Do we know the impact of invasive species
 - √ How fast are our coasts eroding





- Marine knowledge Coastal mapping
 - Checkpoints confirm demand for better near-coast topography
 - ✓ Needed by offshore developers, erosion managers
 - ✓ Not adequately mapped because not navegable
 - ✓ New promising techniques
 - Contract signed June 2015 for € 1,3m
 - ✓ Consortium of national hydrographic agencies
 - ✓ Developing common standards and baselines
 - ✓ Sharing surveying knowledge and tools
 - ✓ Joining up to map topography
 - ✓ Building portal to download data





- Marine knowledge High resolution seabed mapping
 - EMODnet:
 - ✓ Already produces digital maps with 16 times better resolution than previously publicly available
 - ✓ Extensively used by researchers, public authorities and private bodies
 - ✓ Third party providers developing new services using data
 - Call for tender to be launched shortly (€5,1m allocated)
 - ✓ Will build on previous work including coastal mapping
 - ✓ Resolution to be increased and will be even greater where underlying data available





- Marine knowledge Data capture and ingestion
 - EMODnet distributes data held in national archives but many data do not reach archives
 - Evaluation of tendering in final stage (€4,2m allocated)
 - √ Facilitate transfer of data for safekeeping
 - ✓ Guidance and help-desk for researchers and private companies
 - ✓ Portal to accept data and distribute to appropriate repositories
 - ✓ Data to be disseminated through EMODnet





- Marine knowledge Monitoring of Oceans
- Satellites measure surface temperature but need to measure below surface:
 - Impact on climate change
 - Changes to ocean circulation and understanding marine life
- Grant to Euro-ARGO signed in June 2015 (€4m)
 - Recognised European Research Infrastructure consortium
 - Measure down to 2000 metres
 - Purchase and deployment of 150 floats: contribution to global programme





- Maritime spatial planning Assistance mechanism
 - Renewable annual contract signed December 2015 (€1,1m) to:
 - ✓ Provide administrative and technical assistance to MS in implementation of MSP Directive
 - ✓ Dissemination of useful info on implementation of MSP
 - ✓ Operational summaries of best practices
 - ✓ Publicising of funding sources





- Maritime spatial planning Cross-border MSP
- 3 grants awarded in 2015 (total € 5,6m) for MS cooperation projects by sea basin
 - Baltic progressing well
 - Celtic has just begun
 - Black Seas ongoing
- Similar format being followed for allocation in WP 2015 (deadline for call 31/3/2016) focus on
 - Northern European Atlantic
 - Eastern and Western Mediterranean





- Integrated Maritime surveillance implementation of CISE
 - Improving interoperability of surveillance systems at national level to prepare for CISE
 - 7 grants concluded with authorities from 5 MS (total €3,2m)
 - Joint kick-off meeting held on 19 January 2016
 - Follow-up call for proposals (WP 2015) launched recently (€2,5m allocated)
 - Care taken to ensure complementarity and avoid overlaps with other funding streams (e.g.FP7 and ISA – "Interoperability Solutions for European Public Administrations").





Blue growth

- Variety of actions supported including:
 - ✓ Ocean energy forum secretariat and support for development of roadmap for ocean energy
 - ✓ Study analysing challenges for sustainable development of coastal and maritime tourism
 - ✓ Seeking improved marine and martime cooperation in the Mediterranean via a virtual Knowledge Centre
 - ✓ Study to establish a framework for processing and analysing martime economic data and track performance of industries and businesses in a reliable evidence-based manner





- Marine Strategy Framework Directive (MSFD) implementation
 - 4 grant agreements concluded in 2015 (€2,5m) for improved MSFD regional-level monitoring, indicators, data, assessment and knowledge base
 - For WP 2015 allocation, call for proposals to be launched soon providing grants for next phase of MSFD implementation
 - Study finalised on development of measures to combat range of marine litter sources – results will be used for developing EU policy on marine litter reduction

- Strengthening of **regional cooperation** in the area of fisheries **data collection**:
 - ✓ First two grant agreements signed on 08/04/2015 (14 month duration including 2 month extension):
 - 1) Mediterranean and Black Sea
 - 2) North Sea and Eastern Arctic
 - ✓ Aim is to analyze main coordination activities & tools already in place in the 2 regions and; propose regional sampling plan for each area.
 - ✓ Report will be used for the establishment of the Regional Coordination Groups and national work plans.
 - ✓ Future grants will build on these first achievements.





- Strengthening of **regional cooperation** in the area of fisheries **data collection**:
- Following areas of work have been chosen:
 - ✓ Drawing up of a sampling plan for commercial fisheries
 - ✓ Propose common methodologies to be followed by all MS within the same sea basin
 - ✓ Drawing up of a sampling plan for new ecosystem data
- Final outcome of grants will be a regional work programme for each area and wide regional consultation





• Strengthening of regional cooperation in the area of fisheries data collection:

Main outcomes of interim reports:

- Cooperation between 2 grants (data quality)
- Med & Black Sea grant:
 - ✓ WP1: overview of current situation
 - ✓ WP2: agreement on stocks and common methodologies
 - ✓ WP3: agreement on stocks
- North Sea & Eastern Arctic grant:
 - ✓ WP2: agreement on stocks and common methodologies
 - ✓ WP3: additional work on small scale and recreational fisheries





- 2014-2015 advice provided by ICES and STECF:
 - ✓ **STECF** 15-20 scientific reports to DG MARE over two years; mainly provision of scientific background for:
 - ✓ implementation of landing obligations and management plans
 - ✓ stock assessment in the Mediterranean and Black Sea;
 - ✓ Socio-economic situation of the EU fleet as well as aquaculture and processing sectors
 - ✓ **ICES** biological advice on status of 164 stocks in 2014 and 231 stocks in 2015.
 - Commission formulates its annual TAC proposals on basis of ICES advice





- Selection of studies, including those on-going
 - ✓ Availability and dissemination of DCF data: aims to build on outcomes of first feasibility study and outline IT solutions (future IT infrastructure) for DCF data availability and sharing; should allow for harmonisation at EU level, taking into account ongoing initiatives at regional level
 - ✓ Approaches to management of data-poor stocks in mixed fisheries
 - ✓ Tagging study to determine cod mortality sources in Irish sea
 - ✓ Implementation of landing obligation in Black Sea
 - ✓ Economic importance of activities ancillary to fishing in EU





Control and enforcement

Main areas:

- Shared control chartering / purchase
 - ✓ call for applications in 2014 unsuccessful; single application received following 2015 call
- Development of IT
- Control missions:
 - √ 450 (in 2015) missions to control and evaluate the implementation of the CFP.

- ✓ Maintenance of IT systems to support CFP (e.g. EU Fleet Register)
- ✓ New systems delivered (ACDR, QUOTA, FLUX) on aggregated catch reporting, quota follow and transmission of fisheries data
- ✓ Projects under development

- ✓ VINT (Executing phase) (Monitoring vessels in inter'l waters)
- ✓ FLEET (Planning phase)
- ✓ IT Technology Stack (Planning phase)

Contributions to International organisations:

- ✓ International Convention for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT) – Atlantic-wide research programme for Bluefin Tuna
- ✓ Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC) Scientific activities, annual meeting etc.
- ✓ Western Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC) tagging, shark-finning, workshops etc.
- ✓ FAO General Fisheries Commission for the Mediterranean (GFCM) and Regional projects
- ✓ Other smaller contributions



- ICCAT Atlantic-wide research programme for Bluefin Tuna
 - Objectives are to improve:
 - ✓ 1. Data collection
 - ✓ 2. Understanding of key biological and ecological processes
 - √ 3. Assessment models and provision of scientific advice on stock status
 - Phase VI envisages external review of results obtained so far
 - 4 priority actions:
 - ✓ 1. Data mining and data recovery
 - √ 2. Biological and genetic sampling and analysis
 - ✓ 3. Tagging, both conventional and electronic
 - √ 4. New modelling approaches to stock assessment





- Support to fisheries conservation & management in Pacific Ocean
- Estimation of post release shark survival on Long Line and Purse Seine fisheries (WCPFC: €200.000 and IATTC: €150.000)
- Expected results: evaluation of effectiveness of conservation and management measures prohibiting catch and imposing the discarding of key shark species, in protecting and/or rebuilding key shark species populations in the Pacific





- IATTC Testing of non-entangling and biodegradable Fish Aggregating Devices (FADs)
- <u>Objectives</u>: identify means of constructing non-entangling FADs from biodegradable materials so as to decrease mortality of non-target species (e.g. sharks, turtles), while also minimizing ocean debris and pollution
- Project phases:
- ✓ testing of the durability of biodegradable materials in a costal environment in order to identify the best prototypes for use
- ✓ Deployment of FAD prototypes from tuna purse seine vessels to examine their effectiveness and viability under real fishing conditions
- <u>Expected results</u>: use of these non-entangling and biodegradable designs and materials to be recommended for adoption by fisherme@9





Governance and Communication

Main areas:

- Advisory Councils:
 - Annual grants (€250.000) to each of 7 ACs in 2014 and 2015:
 - ✓ MED AC, BSAC, SWWAC, LDAC, PELAGIC AC, NWWAC, NSAC (3 new Advisory Councils established in 2016)
 - ✓ Regular advice to COM (~45 recommendations p.a. depending also on number of COM initiatives).
 - ✓ With the new CFP, also provide advice to MS, in particular for the development of the discard plans.

- External communication strategy:
 - ✓ Audiovisual: 4 videos with total of 150.000 views on EUtube
 - ✓ Publications: magazines (25.000 subscribers), posters, infographics
 - ✓ Events: Seafood (Brussels), Expo Milan 2015, European Maritime Day (Piraeus)
 - ✓ Website: total of 1.7 m visits in 2015 (up 8% on 2014)
 - ✓ Electonic newsletter (11.900 subscribers)
 - ✓ Social media (12.000 twitter followers and 50.000 facebook likes)

 - ✓ Prospective analysis tool and analysis
- ✓ Ongoing studies on the supply chain in various markets
