Updates to Commission proposal for a Council Regulation fixing for 2023 the fishing opportunities for certain fish stocks, applicable in Union waters and, for Union fishing vessels, in certain non-Union waters, as well as fixing for 2023 and 2024 such fishing opportunities for certain deep-sea fish stocks (COM(2022) 559)

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## 1. AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO COASTAL STATES STOCKS

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Mackerel (*Scomber scombrus*) and blue whiting (*Micromesistius poutassou*) in the northeast Atlantic and Atlanto-Scandian herring (*Clupea harengus*) are subject to annual North-East Atlantic Fisheries Commission (NEAFC) coastal States consultations on fishing opportunities. Such multilateral consultations on fishing opportunities for 2023 were held on 17 November and 5-6 December 2022 in London for mackerel, on 14 October and 6 December 2022 in London for blue whiting, and on 14 October in London and 4 November 2022 virtually for Atlanto-Scandian herring, on the basis of the EU positions agreed by the Council. The outcome of those consultations was documented in an Agreed Record for Atlanto-Scandian herring for 2023 on 4 November 2022, for blue whiting in the northeast Atlantic for 2023 on 6 December 2022, and for mackerel in the northeast Atlantic for 2023 on 6 December 2022. The total allowable catches (TACs) for those stocks were set in line with the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) scientific advice.

NEAFC recommendations on conservation and management measures for Atlanto-Scandian herring and blue whiting for 2023 were adopted during the 2022 NEAFC annual meeting. The adoption by NEAFC of a recommendation on conservation and management measures for mackerel for 2023 is under preparation.

It is therefore proposed to establish the fishing opportunities for Atlanto-Scandian herring and blue whiting based on the level of the TAC set out in the NEAFC recommendations for 2023 (i.e. no more than 511 171 tonnes for Atlanto-Scandian herring and no more than 1 359 629 tonnes for blue whiting), and in line with the approach applied for 2021 and 2022. To avoid interruption of the fishing activities until the mackerel NEAFC recommendation is adopted, it is therefore proposed to establish the relevant fishing opportunities at the level set out in that Agreed Record (i.e. no more than 782 066 tonnes), which is in line with the approach applied for 2021 and 2022.

## 2. AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO EU-NO-UK STOCKS

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

## Introduction

The EU held trilateral consultations with the UK and Norway on six shared and jointly managed stocks occurring within the areas under the jurisdiction of all three Parties, with the aim to agree on the management of those stocks, including the fishing opportunities for 2023.

The EU conducted the trilateral consultations with the UK and Norway in accordance with the objectives and principles set out in Articles 2, 3, 28 and 33 of Regulation (EU) No 1380/2013<sup>1</sup> as well as Article 5 of the North Sea multiannual plan<sup>2</sup> (MAP), and the Commission non-paper on the approach to be taken in the consultations with the United Kingdom and Norway to agree on fishing opportunities for shared stocks for 2023 endorsed by the Council. Consultations were conducted by the Commission in full coordination with the Council. The PECH Committee of the European Parliament was involved through periodic information and update sessions.

When agreeing during the consultations to targeted and by-catch stocks TAC levels, the Commission acted in full compliance with the EU applicable legal framework. Similarly, when agreeing during the consultations to analytical and precautionary approach stocks, the Commission based itself on the best available scientific advice, as provided by the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES).

On 9 December 2022, the Commission agreed with the UK and Norway trilaterally on the setting of 18 TACs covering the six jointly managed stocks. The agreement in principle was laid down in the Agreed Record, which was signed by the Heads of Delegation of the Parties on 9 December 2022.

It is therefore proposed to set TACs corresponding to fishing opportunities as agreed in the Agreed Record of the above-mentioned consultations with the UK and with Norway. Such fishing opportunities for 2023 will allow for the conduct of fishing activities in a sustainable way in the long-term, managed in ways consistent with the objectives of achieving economic, social and employment benefits and contributing to the availability of food supplies, including promotion of

a level playing field for Union operators where stocks are shared with third countries in both Union and third country waters.

## General approach

In line with the core conservation objective of the Common Fisheries Policy as set out in Article 2(2) of the CFP Regulation, also recalled in Article 3(1) of the North Sea MAP, the Union agreed with the UK and with Norway TACs for stocks with  $F_{MSY}$  advice (advice with levels of fishing opportunities expressing fishing pressure that delivers the maximum sustainable yield – 'MSY').

For four stocks (North Sea cod, North Sea herring, North Sea plaice and North Sea saithe), the fishing opportunities were set in line with the ICES advice and in accordance with the provisions of the North Sea MAP. Moreover, for North Sea cod, the EU will continue with the functionally linked measures introduced in 2020 and 2021. These measures include specific selectivity measures, area closures for protection of spawning aggregations of cod as well as the possibility for Member States to introduce National Cod Avoidance Plans.

For two stocks (North Sea haddock and North Sea whiting), fishing opportunities were set at levels below the ICES advice to take into account their interaction with cod in mixed fisheries. These fishing opportunities levels will contribute to the sustainable management of the North Sea cod stock.

Pending issuance by the Commission of the figures for two herring TACs (HER/4AB. and HER/4CXB7D), fishing opportunities for those TACs are marked pro memoria.

#### AMENDMENTS TO THE RECITALS

In 2022, the Union, the UK and Norway held trilateral consultations on six shared and jointly managed stocks occurring within the areas under the jurisdiction of all three Parties, with the aim to agree on the management of those stocks including the fishing opportunities for 2023. These consultations were conducted between 3 November and 9 December 2022, on the basis of the EU position endorsed by the Council on 20 October 2022. The outcome of the consultations was documented in an Agreed Record, signed by the Head of Delegations of the EU, the UK and Norway on 9 December 2022. It is therefore proposed to set the relevant fishing opportunities at the level agreed with the UK and Norway, together with the other provisions of the Agreed Record.

## 3. AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO WCPFC

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

At its 2022 annual meeting, the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC) decided to maintain the current measures applicable in the WCPFC Convention area. It is therefore proposed to implement those measures in EU law.

Moreover, following the entry into force of Regulation (EU) 2022/2056<sup>3</sup> laying down conservation and management measures applicable in the WCPFC Convention area, the prohibition on discards of tropical tunas caught by purse seiners and the prohibition for silky sharks and oceanic whitetip sharks should be deleted from the Commission proposal<sup>4</sup>, as those provisions are now included in that Regulation.

## 4. AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO SOUTHERN SEABASS

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

In the sixth Commission services non-paper updating the Commission proposal<sup>5</sup>, it was proposed to insert the figures for commercial catches, including landings and discards, and for recreational catches from the ICES technical service<sup>6</sup> on catch scenarios tables for seabass in ICES divisions 8a and 8b for 2023 in recital (12). As such figures were not included in Council Regulation (EU) 2022/109<sup>7</sup>, recital (12) should not include those figures either. It is therefore proposed to amend recital (12) accordingly.

#### AMENDMENTS TO THE RECITALS

Recital (12) is replaced by the following:

"(12) In accordance with the Western Waters MAP established by Regulation (EU) 2019/472, the target fishing mortality for the stocks listed in Article 1(1) of that Regulation is to be maintained within the ranges of F<sub>MSY</sub> defined in Article 2, point (2), of that Regulation, in accordance with Article 4 thereof. The overall fishing mortality for European seabass (*Dicentrarchus labrax*) in ICES divisions 8a and 8b should therefore be set in accordance with ICES MSY advice and with the F<sub>MSY</sub> point value, taking into account commercial catches, including landings and discards, and recreational catches. F<sub>MSY</sub> point value is the fishing mortality value that gives the long-term MSY. The relevant Member States (France and Spain) should take appropriate measures to ensure that the fishing mortality from their fleets and recreational fishers does not exceed the F<sub>MSY</sub> point value, as required by Article 4(3) of Regulation (EU) 2019/472."

# 5. AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO ROUNDNOSE GRENADIER IN THE SKAGERRAK AND KATTEGAT

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

On 10 June 2022, ICES published its scientific advice<sup>8</sup> for roundnose grenadier (*Coryphaenoides rupestris*) in ICES division 3a (Skagerrak and Kattegat) for 2023 and 2024. ICES provides precautionary advice for that stock and advises that there should be zero catch in 2023 and 2024.

In the third Commission services non-paper updating the Commission proposal, it was proposed to set the TACs for unavoidable by-catches of roundnose grenadier in EU waters of ICES subarea 3 for 2023 and 2024 at the level of 2 tonnes.

Considering that biological status of the stock, inter-annual flexibility for quotas of this stock pursuant to Articles 3 and 4 of Regulation (EC) No 847/96 should not apply. It is therefore proposed to amend the fishing opportunities table for that stock, clarifying that inter-annual flexibility should not apply.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Two errors of clerical nature have been detected in the seventh Commission services non-paper updating the Commission proposal:

- In Annex VI, paragraph 5, the footnote should reflect that it is proposed to establish those numbers, and that the numbers may therefore be adapted following the approval of the Union fishing and capacity management plan by ICCAT.
- In Annex VI, paragraph 6, the wording of the footnotes in Tables A and B and in the footnote linked to the title of Table A in Annex VI, paragraph 4, should be consistent.

It is therefore proposed to amend the footnotes accordingly.

For swordfish (*Xiphias gladius*) in the Atlantic Ocean, north of 5° N, 40 tonnes of the EU quota for 2023 should be transferred to Saint-Pierre et Miquelon in accordance with ICCAT recommendation 17-02. It is therefore proposed to reduce the EU quota and Other Member States quota for 2023 for that stock accordingly.
