Delegation in practice



- *EC/DG MARE – political responsibility:*
 - Set political priorities
 - Adoption EMFF work programme
 - EMFF programme evaluations
 - Supervision of EASME
- *EASME – implementation:*
 - Prepare and publish calls, manage evaluation, contracts, payments, assess reports, monitor and control
 - Direct contacts with applicants/beneficiaries
 - Report to EC/DG MARE

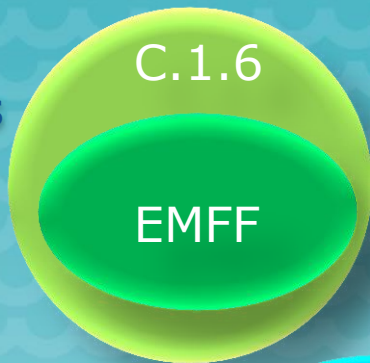
